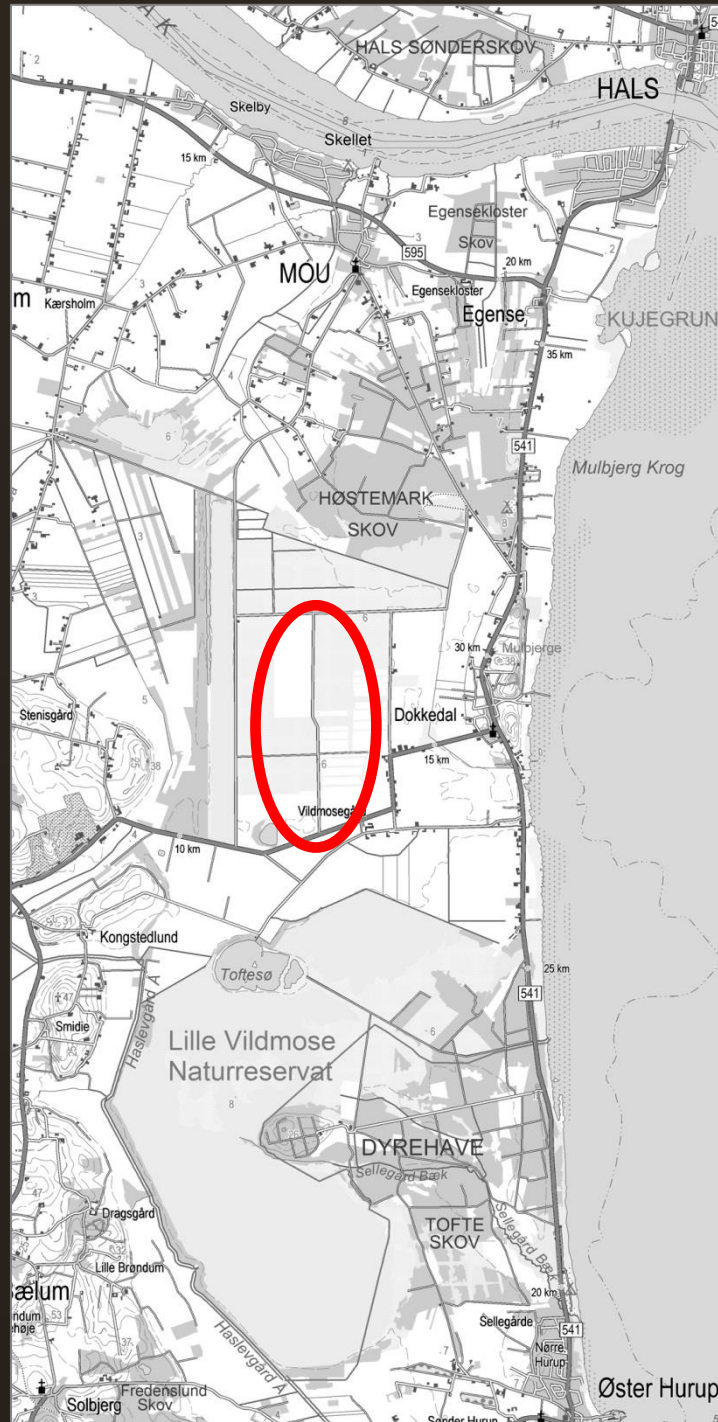
Grønvej 2007-2009

In the areas around the dirt road Grønvej we are in the heart of the bog. It is one of my favorite places in the bog, Lille Vildmose. Often I cycle out here. It is, however, a bike-ride with many interruptions. I only just get on my bicycle and start again before I have to stop and watch and photograph something remarkable: A bird on the wide open spaces or an insect in the rich vegetation along the dirt road.

Previously, a lot of cattle and horses feed off the fields along the dirt road, and a large area was used to production of sphagnum. Today most of these large areas again are dedicated to nature. Now, in the summer we can watch the cranes strut about on the horizon. They are shy birds and keep human beings at a long distance.

The fox and the roe-deer today have become accustomed not to be exposed to hunting. Therefore, I often have observed these beautiful animals while they are concentrated on foraging in the dense vegetation.

I have often been on a bicycle ride out here and watched heavy rain clouds appear on the horizon. It is a beautiful sight. Here on the flat bog the sky feels so impressively large. The distant horizon gives an enormous view in all directions. But if the bad weather really breaks loose, it is not a good place to stay when the thunderstorm arrives.

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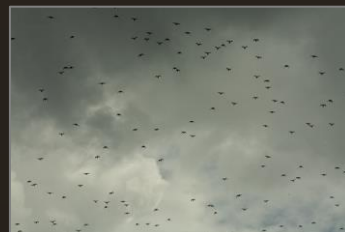
