Møllesøvej 2017-2021

Møllesøvej er den østligste af de lange veje, der løber fra nord til syd gennem Lille Vildmose. Vejen er en lang, lige grusvej, som forbinder Hegnsvej i nord og ender i vejen, der forbinder Dokkedal med Sønder Kongerslev.

Vejens navn indikerer, at området tidligere var den største sø i Lille Vildmose. Møllesø blev afvandet i året 1760. Metoden var at grave en kanal fra Kattegat ind i søen. På kort tid blev søen tørlagt, og søbunden blev omdannet til landbrugsjord. I den sydligste ende af søen blev gården Vildmosegård etableret. I dag er disse bygninger en del af besøgscentret for naturområdet Lille Vildmose.

Forskellige dyr benytter de store enge i løbet af årets sæsoner. I sensommeren ses store flokke af viber og stære, og det er også på denne tid, at traner ofte besøger områderne, når de fouragerer på en sommeraften. Svalerne har kastet deres kærlighed på de insekter, der sværmer omkring de store bunker af tørv. Dette er også jagtområde for falke, som ofte kan ses langs vejen, mens de sidder og æder en gnaver. Om vinteren fouragerer store flokke af sangsvaner på de våde marker.

Gårdene langs vejen er oprindeligt finansieret af den danske stat. I perioden 1952-1959 blev der etableret 23 nye gårde i forbindelse med opdyrkningen af Lille Vildmose.

Tiderne ændrer sig: I dag naturgenoprettes de tidligere landbrugsområder.

The road Møllesøvej 2017-2021

The road Møllesøvej is the easternmost of the long roads from north to south through the bog Lille Vildmose. The road is a long straight dirt road that connects Hegnsvej in the north and ends in the road that connects Dokkedal with Sønder Kongerslev.

The name of the road indicates that the current land formerly was the largest lake in Lille Vildmose. Møllesø were drained in the year 1760. The method was to dig a canal from the Kattegat into the lake. In a short time, the lake was drained, and the lake bottom was converted to farmland. In the lakes southernmost end, the farm Vildmosegård was established. Today these farm buildings are a part of the visitor centre for the natural area Lille Vildmose.

Various guests use the large meadows in the seasons of the year. In late summer, there are large flocks of lapwings and starlings, and it is also at this time of the year the cranes often visit these areas when they forage on a summer evening. The swallows have thrown their love of the insects that swarm around the large piles of peat. This is also hunting grounds for the falcons, which often can be seen along the road while they sit and eat a rodent. In the winter large flocks of whooper swans are foraging on the wet fields.

The farms, located along the road are originally financed by the Danish state. In the period 1952-1959 23 new farms were established in connection with the cultivation of Lille Vildmose.

The time is changing: Today, the former agricultural areas are being restored to nature.
