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Alt har sin tid

I min barndom var mosen en stor arbejdsplads. Mosebruget med tørv til opvarmning blev til en mere moderne industri, der producerede tørvestrøelse og bearbejdede produkter til private haver og gartnerier. De områder om mosen, der var under udnyttelse, summede af liv. I 1950'erne og 1960'erne med brug for masser af lokal arbejdskraft, men senere overtog maskinerne arbejdet. I nyere tid har beskæftigelsen i mosen være relativt begrænset.

I dag er al industri i mosen stort set ophørt. Udnyttelsestilladelserne og industriaktiviteterne er erstattet af en omfattende naturfredning, der på sigt forventes at omdanne de golde strækninger med mosebrug til den oprindelige højmoser med søer og en rig flora og fauna.

I dag skal man være godt kendt for at kunne se sporene efter de tidligere industriaktiviteter i den nu tilgroede mose, men de er der. Gravebaner, ældre pumpeanlæg til dræning og skinnelager skjult i den tætte vegetation.

Ugens fotografier viser tidligere tiders aktiviteter med udnyttelse af tørv fra Lille Vildmose. Det, der førhen var en lukrativ beskæftigelse for mange lokale familier, er i dag borte.

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In my childhood, the bog was a large workplace. The peat industry, which produced peat for heating, became a more modern industry that produced peat bedding and processed products for private gardens and market gardenings. The areas around the bog that were in use buzzed with activity. In the 1950s and 1960s, there was a great need for local labour, but later machines took over the work. In more recent times, employment in the bog has been relatively limited.

Today, all industrial activity in the bog has mostly ceased. The exploitation permits and industrial activities have been replaced by extensive nature conservation, which in the long term is expected to transform the barren stretches of peatland back into the original raised bog with lakes and rich flora and fauna.

Nowadays, you need to be well-acquainted with the area to spot the traces of past industrial activities in the now overgrown bog, but they are there. Trenches, older pumping systems for drainage, and rail tracks are hidden in the dense vegetation.

These photographs of the week show past activities involving the peat extraction from Lille Vildmose. What once was a lucrative occupation for many local families is now gone.
