Mulbjergene II

Når der ligger nogle små bakker omgivet af en flad mose på den ene side og et fladt hav på den anden side, så må disse bakker hedde noget med 'bjerge'. Især når disse små bakker så også er beliggende i et land, hvis højeste punkt ikke når op på små to hundrede meter.

Mulbjergene kan ses, hvor man end befinder sig i Lille Vildmose. Mulbjergene, der er morænebakker, danner grænsen mellem mosen og farvandet Kattegat. Mulbjergene er delvist dækket af skov og delvist dækket af græs, hvor fårene græsser. Bakkerne når en højde på 30 til 40 meter over de flade omgivelser.

For foden af Mulbjergene ligger landsbyen Dokkedal. Midt i landsbyen ligger Remisen, hvor de gamle håndværk og maskiner knyttet til tidligere tiders mosebrug i Lille Vildmose holdes i hævd.

Mulbjergene er et godt sted at starte besøget i Lille Vildmose. Fra bakkerne er der en god udsigt ud over det store, flade mose-landskab.

Mulbjergene var under 2. Verdenskrig hjemsted for tyske kystforsvarsanlæg. Rester af betonanlæggene kan fortsat findes rundt omkring i området. I dag er området fredet.

The hills Mulbjergene II

When there are some small hills surrounded by a flat bog on one side and a flat sea on the other, then those hills must surely be called something with “mountains” (in Danish, bjerge). Especially when these small hills are in a country whose highest point barely reaches two hundred meters.

The Mulbjerg Hills can be seen from anywhere in Lille Vildmose. These hills, which are moraine hills, form the boundary between the bog and the Kattegat Sea. The Mulbjerg Hills are partly covered by forest and partly by grass, where sheep graze. The hills rise 30 to 40 meters above the flat surroundings.

At the foot of the Mulbjerg Hills lies the village of Dokkedal. In the middle of the village is Remisen, where the old crafts and machinery related to the past peat industry in Lille Vildmose are preserved.

The Mulbjerg Hills are a great place to start a visit to Lille Vildmose. From the hills, there is a good view out over the vast, flat bog landscape.

During World War II, the Mulbjerg Hills were home to German coastal defense installations. Remnants of the concrete structures can still be found scattered throughout the area. Today, the area is protected.
